AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AND ADOPTING FOR THE CITY (or Town) OF Ord Grove, ARKANSAS, FOR THE TWELVE (12) MONTHS BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 30/3, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 20/3;
APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR EACH AND EVERY ITEM OF EXPENDITURE THEREIN PROVIDED FOR; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY TO EXIST; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.
WHEREAS, the City (or Town) Council has made a comprehensive study and review of the proposed budget, and
WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City (or Town) Council that the schedules and exhibits of financial information prepared and reviewed revealing anticipated revenues and expenditures for the calendar year appear to be as accurate as possible for budgetary purposes,
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY (or Town) COUNCIL OF Och Grove, ARKANSAS:
Section 1. This ordinance shall be known as the budget ordinance for the City (or Town) of Oak Drove, Arkansas, for the twelve (12) month period beginning January 1, 20/3, and ending December 31, 20/3, reflecting estimated revenues and expenditures as hereinafter set forth on the succeeding pages. All revenues herein are estimated and subject to change and all appropriations are calculated upon available revenues.

Whereas, it is necessary for the efficient operation of Municipal Government that a budget be planned and adopted; now therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
