

Minutes of Meeting  
September 26, 1966

The Oak Grove Community Center met for a called meeting at the Community building Monday night, September 26, 1966. There were 38 present, including President Alfred Atchley, Vice-president Wayne Plumlee, Secretary-Treasurer Ruth Callen, and Board members Herman Butler, Fay Humbard and Finis McCrary. Board members absent were Jack Newman and Gene Plumlee.

Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Alfred Atchley, president, followed by prayer by Jessie Atchley. Minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

It was agreed to hold meetings only when needed, rather than hold regular meetings. Motion was made by Ruby Plumlee and seconded by L.O. Tisdale that it be left to Board members to make by-laws and decisions. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on carrying insurance on building. Motion was made by Clete Callen and seconded by Finis McCrary that building be insured. Motion carried. Motion was made by Herman Butler and seconded by Ethel Case that insurance price be set. Motion carried. It was agreed that the Board members decide valuation. It was decided by Board members present to set the amount of insurance at \$4500.

It was reported that the Extension Homemakers Club wants to buy new door locks for the building and furnish the president of each active Club with a key. Motion was made by Kenneth Allen and seconded by L. O. Tidale to let the Club ladies do so.

Motion carried. Motion was made by George Humbard and seconded by Herman Butler that Raymond Atchley get the locks and install them. Motion carried.

Everyone was urged to vote in the coming school election.

A collection of \$41.75 was taken.

It was suggested that a fund-raising committee, consisting of three members, one from each of the three Clubs, be appointed. Fay Humbard nominated Jean Swafford, Herman Butler nominated Leita Newman, and Sherman Garner nominated Ethel Case, to work as committee. All agreed to serve, and decided on a Chili supper to be held at the Community building Saturday, October 8.
