

The Oak Grove Community Center met for a called meeting at the Community building Monday evening, June 17, 1968. There were 26 present, including President Alfred Atchley, Secretary-treasurer Ruth Callen, and Board Members Fay Humbard, Herman Butler and Finis McCreary. Vice-president Wayne Plumlee and Board Members Jack Newman and Gene Plumlee were absent.

Meeting was called to order at 8:30 p.m. by Alfred Atchley, president. Minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

It was reported that a \$90⁰⁰ Little League Ball Fund had been deposited to the Community Center bank account from the now defunct Booster Club. Discussion was held on whether to use the money to buy wire and bases to be used by older boys now playing ball. Motion was made by Finis McCreary and seconded by Herman Butler that the money be used to buy wire, bases and pitcher's mound. Motion carried.

It was reported that there was not enough money in the treasury to pay the next electric bill. Discussion was held on how to raise funds. Ed Swofford, President of the Saddle Club, reported that the Saddle Club would donate some money to the Community Center, the amount to be decided upon at their next meeting on June 24. It was agreed that the same finance committee, consisting of Ethel Case, Eula Dean Allen and Jean Swofford, be retained. It was decided to have an ice cream supper Monday night, July 1. 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It was reported that the building is in need of some paint. Kenneth Allen nominated Jimmy White, Fay Hubbard nominated Ray Metz, and Jimmy White nominated Herman Butler to serve as a committee to buy paint, etc., when

funds are available. All agreed to serve. Discussion was held on whether or not new Board Members should be elected. It was agreed to retain the same members.

The street lights, which had been sponsored by the Booster Club, were discussed. Ethel Case agreed to continue as treasurer for the lights. Bella Towell and Clate Callen were selected to work with her as a committee to collect for them.

Kenneth Allen suggested that the town of Oak Grove should be incorporated and agreed to find out details concerning this.

Alfred Atchley announced that there would be a meeting of the Carroll and Madison Advisory Board the following night at the Community Building and urged everyone to attend.

Motion was made by Guy Hamblard and seconded by Earl Case that meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
