

The Oak Grove Community Center met for a called meeting at the Community building Thursday evening, May 11, 1978. There were 53 adults present, including President Alfred Atchley, Secretary-treasurer Ruth Callen and Board Members Jack Newman, Gene Plumlee, Fay Hubbard and Finis McCreary. Vice-president Wayne Plumlee and Board Member Herman Butler, who are no longer residents of the community, were absent.

Meeting was called to order at 7:35 p.m. by Alfred Atchley, president, who explained that the purpose of the meeting was to decide whether or not the Community building and grounds should be turned over to the City.

Mayor Russell Plumlee reported that the name or the way in which the Center has been operating would not be changed, but since the City has funds available, improvements could be made, including some playground equipment.

After much discussion, motion was made by Jack Pharis that a vote be taken. Motion was seconded and carried. Vote was taken by secret ballot. Results were 37 "yes" and 14 "no" voters.

It was agreed that a clause should be added in the deed to read that the property could not be sold by the city, but would fall back to the community.

It was decided that the Community Center would pay the cost of the deed.

Meeting adjourned at 9:30 p.m.
