

OAK GROVE TOWN COUJCIL MEETING MINUTES
DATE: JANUARY 4,2000

THE OAK GROVE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF OAK GROVE, AR., MET FOR A REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING ON JANUARY 7,2000, IN THE TOWN HALL. THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY MAYOR JEAN MORGAN AND A QUORUM WAS ESTABLISHED. ON ROLL CALL THE FOLLOWING WERE PRESENT: ALDERMEN EUGENE REYNOLDS, SAM JONES AND GARY HIGH. ALDERWOMEN: PAT HIGH AND VICKIE ALLEN, RECORDER PAT CARLTON.

THE FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS WAS THE READING OF DECEMBER MINUTES. THE MINUTES WERE READ. ALDERWOMAN PAT HIGH MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES AS READ, ALDERMAN GARY HIGH SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL IN FAVOR SAY I. FIVE I'S. OPPOSED BY THE SAME. NONE.

THE NEXT ORDER OF BUSINESS WAS THE PRESENTATION OF THE BILLS. THE BILLS WERE PRESENTED TO THE COUNCIL, WAS CHECKED AND INITIALED. ALDERMAN EUGENE REYNOLDS MADE A MOTION TO ALLOCATE MONEY TO PAY THE BILLS. ALDERMAN SAM JONES SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL IN FAVOR SAY I. FIVE I'S. OPPOSED BY THE SAME. NONE.

THE NEXT ORDER OF BUSINESS WAS THE MAYORS REPORT AND DISCUSSION WITH COUNCIL. PAT CARLTON HAS CHECKED WITH PAM DISHROON AND BALL, ALLEN, AND ASSOCIATES ABOUT THE AUDIT THE WATER DEPARTMENT HAS TO HAVE. THERE IS VERY LITTLE DIFFERENCE IN COST OF THE TWO. COUNCIL SAID TO GO WITH PAM DISHROON SINCE SHE DONE THE AUDIT BEFORE. THE MAYOR HAS SENT THE GRANT OFF FOR THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND HAS BEEN NOTIFIED THEY HAVE RECEIVED IT AND IT WAS FILLED OUT TO SPEFICATIONS. SHE HAS CALLED THE EPA ABOUT THE BUILDINGS THAT ARE PARTLALLY FALLING DOWN, TORN DOWN AND BURNED DOWN. THEY WERE OUT OF OFFICE BUT WILL GET BACK WITH HER ABOUT WHAT CAN BE DONE AS FAR AS DISPOSAL OF SUCH. SHE READ ALPENA'S CLEAN PREMISES ORDIANCE. DOES THE COUNCIL WANT THIS SENT TO LAWYER EPLEY, TO SEE IF WE CAN USE OR NEED IT. THE COUNCIL SAYS YES. GOT A LETTER FROM CARROLL ELECTRIC ABOUT THE COST OF MOVING THE LIGHT POLE THAT STANDS IN FRONT OF FUTURE FIRE BUILDING. HOLD ON ABOUT MOVING TILL IT CAN BE DETERMINED IF IT IS NECESSARY.

THE NEXT ORDER OF BUSINESS WAS THE RECOGNITION OF DELEGATION. BONNIE OTT WAS PRESENT, SHE WAS CONCERNED ABOUT A LARGE REFRIGERATOR TRUCK THAT PARKS NEAR THE HOUSES OF SOME ELDERLY AND LEAVES THE REFRIGERATED TRAILOR RUNNING ALL NIGHT AND DAY, IT IS VERY LOUD. SHE WAS TOLD THAT THE TRUCK IS PROBABLY PARKED ON THE RIGHT OF WAY AND SHE NEEDS TO CALL THE SHERIFF OR HIGHWAY PATROL..SHE COMMENDED THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL FOR THEIR WORK. I THINK YOU ALL DO A WONDERFUL JOB. ANNA MATTHEWS WAS ALSO PRESENT.

ALDERMAN EUGENE REYNOLDS SAID THE DEPT. NEEDS SOME VALVES AND LANTERNS AND A RADIO FOR FIRE TRUCKS. ALDERMAN GARY HIGH MADE A MOTION TO GIVE THE FIRE DEPT. \$1100.00 TO BE PAID BACK WHEN MONEY BECOMES AVAILABLE. ALERMAN SAM JONES SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL IN FAVOR SAY I. FIVE I'S. OPPOSED BY THE SAME. NONE.
